# Quality Assurance Initiatives (2021-22)

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell has made various policies giving importance to the work of education, research and extension while taking steps towards the quality of education. Now the University has its own Admission Policy, International Student Policy, University Publication Policy, Research Promotion Policy and Sports Promotion Policy. To promote research among the faculty members, a plan has been made by the university to allot research projects on the basis of merit to all the applicant faculty members under the minor research project scheme.

## A. Effective Implementation of NEP 2020 Provisions:

Organizing several rounds of seminars, discussions, write shops and workshops, these are structured on the major issues of implementing CBCS (Choice-based Credit System), *and LOCF* (Learning outcome-based curriculum framework) under *NEP 2020*. The University is standardizing the curriculum structure to achieve the transfer of academic credits to the academic bank of credits (ABC), as enunciated in NEP-2020.

## **B.** Academic Development and Quality Enhancement:

The University is developing the HRDC to conduct faculty development programs on campus. The proposal sent by IQAC to the Govt. of Rajasthan under the Rajasthan Higher Technical Quality Scheme 2022-23 has been sanctioned. The center will develop course materials and academic databases and provide teacher-skilling programs to enhance teaching quality.

# C. Focus on Yoga, Ayurveda, and Indian Knowledge System:

To promote yoga awareness for health and impart skills to all employees of the University and the general public, regular yoga sessions are being organized. Few curricula have been designed focusing on Yoga education and the Indian knowledge system.

# **D.** Industry Collaboration and Apprenticeships:

IQAC has taken initiatives to establish partnerships with universities and encourage industry institute intake through a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU).

# E. Student Support and Engagement:

IQAC is committed to improving the institution's digital infrastructure, knowledge, and skills for vocational training and the internationalization of higher education. This includes enhancing digital resources, fostering digital literacy, and preparing students for global job opportunities. This promotes the overall development of MGSU and is in line with NEP 2020. In addition, The

University has partnered with the National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology (NIELIT) to set up a research center on its campus, and a designated space has already been allocated to NIELIT for this purpose.

#### F. Center of Excellence for Scientific Research (CESR):

IQAC is making many attempts to improve necessary infrastructure, technology, and resources to support interdisciplinary research and teaching. This includes creating smart rooms, establishing the Center of Excellence for Scientific Research (CESR) to provide central equipment facilities and training to all students and researchers to enhance research funding opportunities, and allocating funds for interdisciplinary initiatives and projects.

IQAC has demonstrated its dedication to quality improvement by taking proactive initiatives in various domains. These initiatives are classified into the following categories:

#### 1. Extra classes for competition exams, i.e. NET, GATE, etc.

University has taken the initiative to organize special tutorials for competitive exams like NET/SLET/TOFEL and other government services. Every academic department has established a departmental career counseling and guidance cell to assist students in both their career counseling and preparation for competitive exams.

#### 2. Student seminars

Student seminars are an integrated part and a mode of assessment in the CBCS-based curriculum. The University has implemented CBCS in all PG programmes and student seminars are organized regularly every semester. Implementation of CBCS in UG programmes is underway.

#### 3. Internet and Wi-Fi Facility

The LAN and WiFi Internet facility is already available on the University campus. University has already initiated the tender process for extending the network in the newly constructed academic blocks (III & IV) and buying a new firewall. Due to some technicalities in the tender process, the previous tenders have been canceled. It is a lengthy process however we are trying to expedite the process.

#### 4. Foundation day celebration

The University celebrated its 18th Foundation Day as "Sankalp Diwas" on June 07, 2021. Under five resolutions, appointment of teachers in the University, development of Smart rooms, creation of statutes and ordinances, implementation of CBCS in all programmes, and implementation of LOCF in all programmes as per the National Education Policy-2020. MGSU initiated various improvements in online examination and evaluation system to address continuous comprehensive evaluation (CCE) of students.

#### 5. Scholarships and fellowships

MGSU has the lowest fee structure in the state for regular programmes. However, for SFS programmes the fee is relatively high though. The fee of these programmes is still less than those offered at other universities in Rajasthan. However, students can contact the Nodal Officer Scholarship office for assistance in applying for a scholarship or fellowship under different government programmes. These programmes already benefit several students on campus each year. The scholarship program for on campus Ph.D. scholars has been initiated.

#### 6. Library facilities

In the session 2021-22, library has purchased 5096 books worth Rs. 6837989/- and has already bought the subscription of Bibliotex Digital Library for 10953 e- books worth Rs. 515001/-. These library facilities are available for on campus students as well as for our affiliated colleges. In addition, In addition, the library has developed a detailed future plan to improve its services and satisfy the demands of its patrons. This plan is organised into four separate phases, each of which focuses on a different area of growth.

The library has planned to move into a completely automated and computerised system during Phase One. This involves improving the current infrastructure in order to give readers with a higher quantity of computerized information services. Efforts will be made to improve the library's collection and give access to a variety of online databases, free e-journals, and online networks. In addition, a student smart card system for self-checkout and return will be used to ensure efficient operations. Staff at the library will also be trained to guarantee proper management.

Phase two involves developing a separate website for the University library in order to improve user accessibility. Students' interest in reading and research will be encouraged, and the institutional repository will be expanded to include more informative resources. In addition, a database of University Ph.D. theses will be created.

In Phase three, the library will focus on increasing faculty and student awareness of electronic resources. Workshops and seminars in the field of library and information science will be held at the local, national, and international levels. RFID (Radio-Frequency Identification) technology will be fully implemented in the central library, as well as the adoption of new communication technologies. For added security, the library will be outfitted with CCTV surveillance.

Finally, Phase four aims to provide specialised assistance to all library users. This includes providing free internet access, interlibrary book services, and connecting with reputable libraries such as IIT, CU libraries. The library intends to collect and make available free e-books from the internet. Career and employment information/services will also be available, and a consortium will be formed to connect all of the University's affiliated colleges. A union catalogue will also be created for affiliated colleges.

The library is committed to improving services, embracing technology, and fostering a conducive learning environment for the benefit of its users through these well-defined phases.

#### 7. Blended mode of learning

On the University campus, lectures are delivered in a blended format. A teacher cannot teach in both modes at the same time; however, Google Classrooms and video lectures have been created and maintained by teachers so that absentees can review missed lectures and other relevant study material.

#### 8. Hostel Facility

The boys and girls hostel have been constructed but they were not functional due to the pandemic situation. The University has appointed hostel wardens and appointment of other staff is underway.

#### 9. Skill-Oriented Courses

University has proposed many courses in several skill-oriented courses in 2018 and we are taking initiative to start new skill-based courses from time to time. MGSU provides a range of skill development courses. As described above, these courses include P.G. Diploma in

Computer Applications, P.G. Diploma in Industrial Biotechnology, P.G. Diploma in Quality Control and Assurance (Microbial Technology), P.G. Diploma in Legal and Forensic Science, P.G. Diploma in Nutrition and Dietetics, P.G. Diploma in Pharmaceutical Microbiology, P.G. Diploma in Pharmaceutical Sales Management, and P.G. Diploma in Yoga and Naturopathy. These programs also include research internships and apprenticeships. Other than these MGSU has also outlined several plans to strengthen vocational education and skill development in line with NEP 2020. These include the implementation of a credit structure where every student will be required to take at least one vocational course, ensuring practical skills and employability. MGSU is trying to collaborate with industry veterans and master craftsmen to provide vocational skills training, bridging the gap between theory and practice. Vocational education will be offered through flexible modes such as Open and Distance Learning, blended learning, and oncampus modular courses, providing accessibility to learners and remote learning opportunities. The partnership with the National Skill Development Corporation will be initiated to create a unified platform for learner enrollment, skill mapping, and certification.

Offering research dissertations or case studies in several PG degrees, supporting internships, industry visits, and collaborations to give students practical experience and improve employability, is a noteworthy practice of the MGSU.

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

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


• University has purchased 30 numbers of (i5/i7) laptops along with 18 no. digital writing pads for faculty members to support online teaching and learning.

• University has also purchased 16+94 no. of i5/i7 computer systems to equip laboratories, faculty, and non-teaching staff.


