# THE CITY

Bikaner is a city in the northwest of the state of Rajasthan in northern India. It is located 330 kilometers (205 miles) northwest of the state capital, Jaipur. Bikaner city is the administrative headquarters of Bikaner District and Bikaner division. It was formerly the capital of the princely state of Bikaner. The city was founded by Rao Bika in 1486 and from its small origin, it has developed into the fifth largest city in Rajasthan. The Gang Canal, completed in 1928, and the Indira Gandhi Canal, completed in 1987 have facilitated its development.

Bikaner has a hot climate with very little rainfall and extreme temperature. The climate in Bikaner is characterised by significant variations in temperature. In the summer season it is very hot when the temperature lies in the range of 28–48.5 °C. In the winter, it is fairly cold with temperature in the range of 2–23.2 °C. Here the annual rainfall is in the range of 260–440 millimeters.

Located in the hallowed Maru Bhumi of Bikaner not less than Chhoti Kashi with temples all around and people with an impeccable sense of religiosity, the land blessed by Goddess Karani, Guru Jambheshwar and the founder of the famous Sankhya Darshan Shri Kapil Muni, the land known for its religiosity with famous temples such as Salasar Balaji and Gogameri, the land known for the love of Dhola-Maru, the land of the people whose distinctiveness, and ancient literature impressed the great Italian scholar Tassitory, the land where was written Krishan Rukmani ri Veli, recognized as the fifth Veda and the Nineteenth Purana in the literary world; the land from where spread the message of peace and non-violence of Acharya Tulsi, the land which has given a taste of Rasgoolas and Namkeens not only to the people of this country but also to all the countries of the world, the University has lightened the lamp of education in the Bikaner Division consisting of the districts of B i k a n e r , Ganganagar, Hanumangarh and Churu.



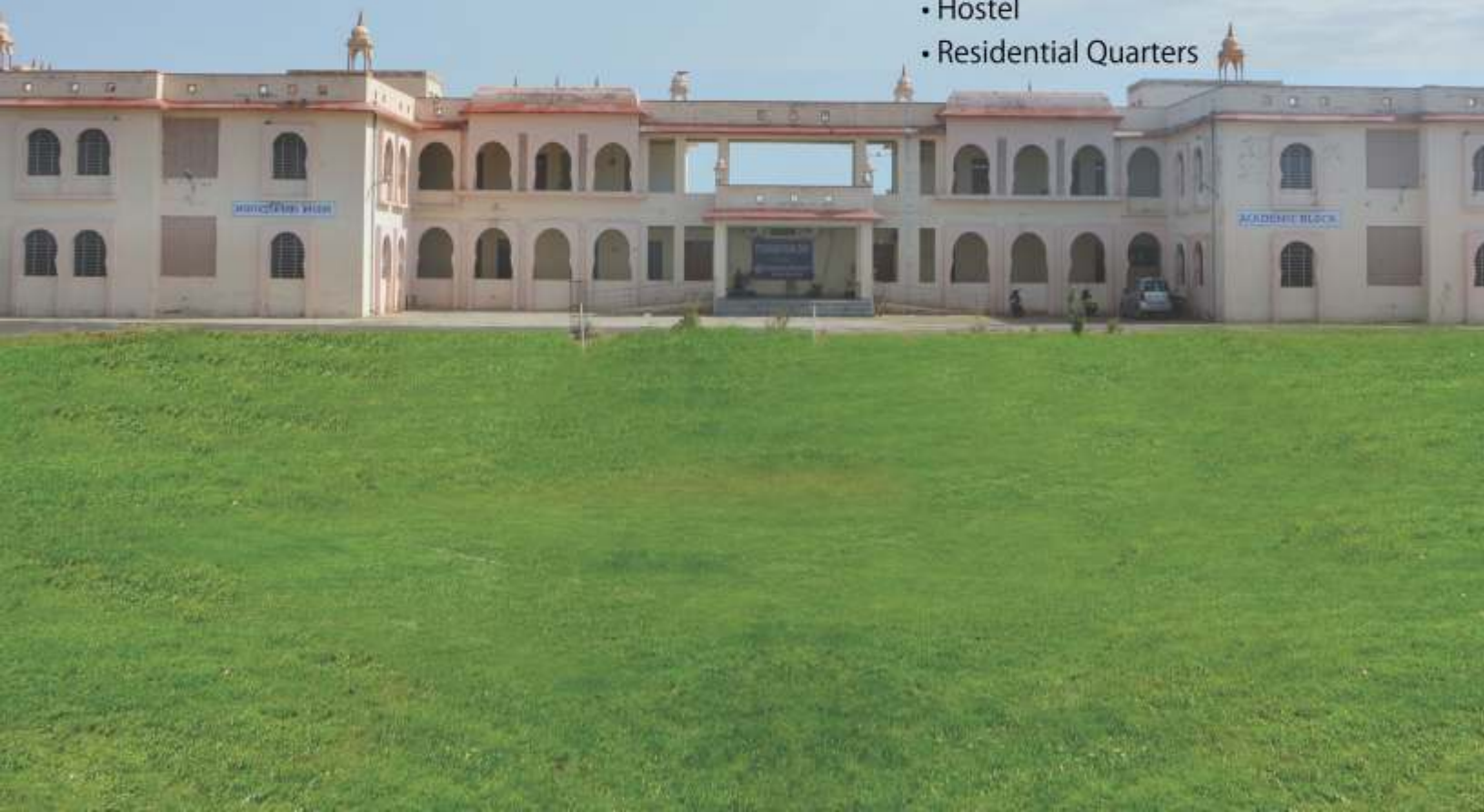
# THE CAMPUS

The Maharaja Ganga Singh University Campus (MGSU) is a self-sufficient enclave with a wide range of facilities including the University Green House, Wifi Building, Bank, Post Office, Canteen, Automated Power Generators, Drinking Water Coolers, Fire Safety Alarms and Extinguishers, Photo-Copier, Furniture, Separate Wash Rooms for male and female, Security Room at the Entrance, First –Aid Medicinal kits, Well-Lit Parking Shades, two Auditoriums (with wall mounted Projectors), comprising a ready Stage, with seating capacity for 125 and 220 persons respectively, suitable for special lectures, technical demonstrations and the technically demanding treatment functions and pageants.

A dedicated – 1 GBPS leased line connecting the whole campus facilitates utilization of all the e-resources. 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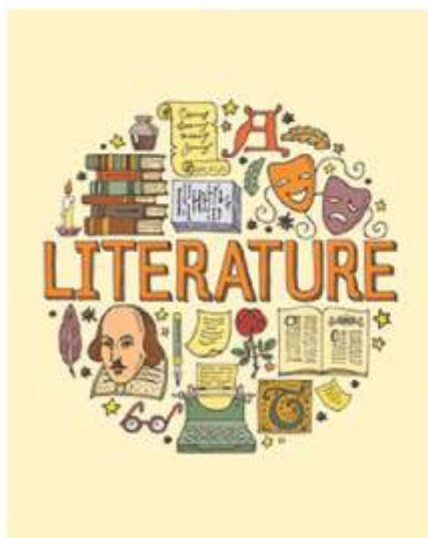

## DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY

The Department of History is one among the five departments of the university that has a lineage of strengthening the academic fabric of the Maharaja Ganga Singh University. Founded in 2011, it is one of the leading and highly reputed centres of learning in the Faculty of Social Sciences. The Department has earned name and fame in the academic circles by ensuring quality teaching and learning atmosphere, innovative Student Centric planning and best performance in the overall functioning of the University.

Ever since its establishment, the Department of History has been carrying out quality research and organizing seminars, conferences and workshops aiming at reconstruction of the History of India. The significance of the Department of History is greatly enhanced due to the availability of archival records preserved in Rajasthan State Archives, Oriental Research Institute and Lalgarh Palace Library, Bikaner for the benefit of students and teachers to carry out original research. The Department has also organized a series of seminars, workshops, conference and training programmes on significant historical themes for benefit of students and the faculty. The Department also organizes the Maharaja Ganga Singh University Memorial Lecture annually. Celebration of the Birth anniversaries of leading historical personalities like Swami Vivekananda, S.C. Bose etc. is part and parcel of the activities of this department. These are aimed at inculcating the feelings of patriotism and national integration among the students. Currently there are three full time following faculty members in the Department.

From the session the department of History has started job oriented professional course at UG and PG levels, which include B.A. Honours, M.A. in Genealogy and Community History and M.A. in Archeology. The introduction of these greatly enhanced the number of students studying in the department and employability of our students. The students of Genealogy and Archeology have been assigned the task of conducting field based studies/cases study so as to construct the comprehensive study of the social, cultural and community history of Rajasthan as a result of the introduction of these new courses the outreach of the department has significantly increased in the society.

## **DEPARTMENT OF** **COMPUTER SCIENCE**

The Department of Computer Science was established in the year 2011 with an objective to produce Computer Science and IT professionals for software industries, research and educational institutions. Today

Information Technology and Computer Application courses have become pervasive, while its parent, Computing Science, has become hard to find. Instead of becoming specialty providers for the IT industry or mass producers of vocationally trained personnel, our Department has chosen to take the road less travelled. We have started with the pristine science that lies under the diverse aspects of computing. This is the single most important feature of the education offered here. The department has tried to develop a distinctive style and method that bridges the theory-practice divide. As the technology changes rapidly, it is necessary for a student to be clear and thorough about the fundamentals. Through sound Fundamentals, they can adapt to the rapid changes in the technology easily. The mission of the department is to give our students a fundamental knowledge of computer science and make them more comfortable with the subjects so that they can choose computer science as professional carrier.

The Department is offering M.Sc. (Computer Science) course since 2011. After the successful journey of five years with this course; Department has 73 alumni, most of them are working in Govt. and private sectors successfully as lecturers, teachers, Information Assistants and System Managers in Banks of public and private sectors. The department is planning to offer specialized courses such as Masters Course in Cyber Security from the upcoming session. The process of establishment of a separate dedicated laboratory equipped with traditional and current security tools has been started to facilitate students.

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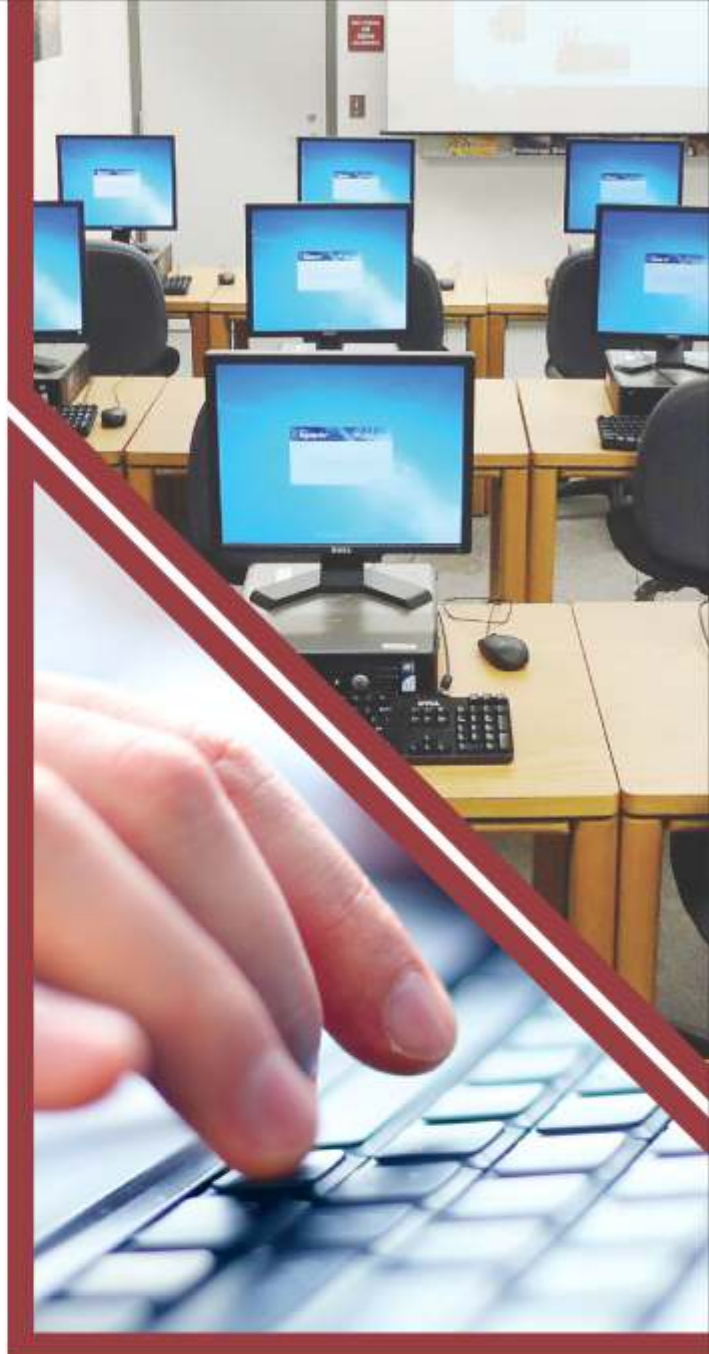

## DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE

The First such Department in the North Western Rajasthan, was established in 2011. The Department offers Post Graduate education (M.Sc. Environmental Science) in this highly professional and job oriented

discipline, besides research degrees of M.Phil. and Ph.D. The Department offers national and international collaborative research and studies, consultancy for Environmental Impact Assessment, Air, water and soil quality management, Pollution abatement, Planning and monitoring of Biodiversity. The department has a well stocked library holding good number of reference and text books on core and allied subjects. It has a state of the art laboratory equipped with almost all required instruments and related paraphernalia. Backed by a highly professional and dedicated faculty to groom young environmental scientists as per the need of industry and job market, the department is equally conscious about research and development. Besides classroom teaching and intensive laboratory working they are taken for education tours and field trips for exposure to real life situations. M.Sc. students are imparted vocational training through industrial and other environmental organizations. Students, right at post graduate level, are required to work on some research projects, field survey, seminar presentation, preparation of green file and herbarium, etc. under supervision of the able faculty so that they have some good research papers/reports in hand as they pass out. Of various academic and co-academic activities, we plan to develop an Eco Club, Biodiversity Park and Herbal Park, a water body and a Weather Station.

A Permanent Global Positioning Station (GPS) in collaboration with MLS Sukhadia University, Udaipur is established to monitor earth data as part of National Network of GPS receivers that collect data from the satellites which can be used for the study of crustal movements, atmospheric behavior, weather forecasting etc. Gyps Vulture Telemetry Research in the Rajasthan in collaboration with Dr. Jonathan C. Hall, Department of Geology & Geography, West Virginia University, Morgantown, USA. The Department had one major consultancy project funded by CAIRN India Limited Gurgaon entitled "Baseline survey on biological diversity from Mangla Oild Field (Barmer) to Bhagat Terminal (Jamnagar)", completed (September, 2013 to March, 2017). One major research project funded by NRSA (IRSO) Hyderabad, under ISRO-Geosphere-Biosphere programme-National Carbon Project-Vegetation Pool Assessment Project running in the Department from 2015 to till date.

The Department in its very first year of inception had the privileged of shouldering responsibility of organizing an International Conference on Advances in Ecological Research (ICAER 2011) in December 2011 which was participated by about 300 environmental scientists from across the world, including those from countries like Columbia, Norway, Nepal, Bangladesh, and Sri Lanka.

The inception of Department in June 2011 was a milestone towards the path of building a Centre of Excellence in the field of Microbiology in the western part of Rajasthan. The

Department has young, dynamic, learned and devoted faculty members, who work incessantly for the welfare of society through the perpetuation of science and technology. The faculty members have to their credit Patent, Research Papers, Research Reviews, Scientific reports, Book articles, Book chapters, Books etc. published in reputed National and International Journals, Books and Publishers.

The Department offers separate courses like M.Sc., M. Phil. and Ph. D. in Microbiology. 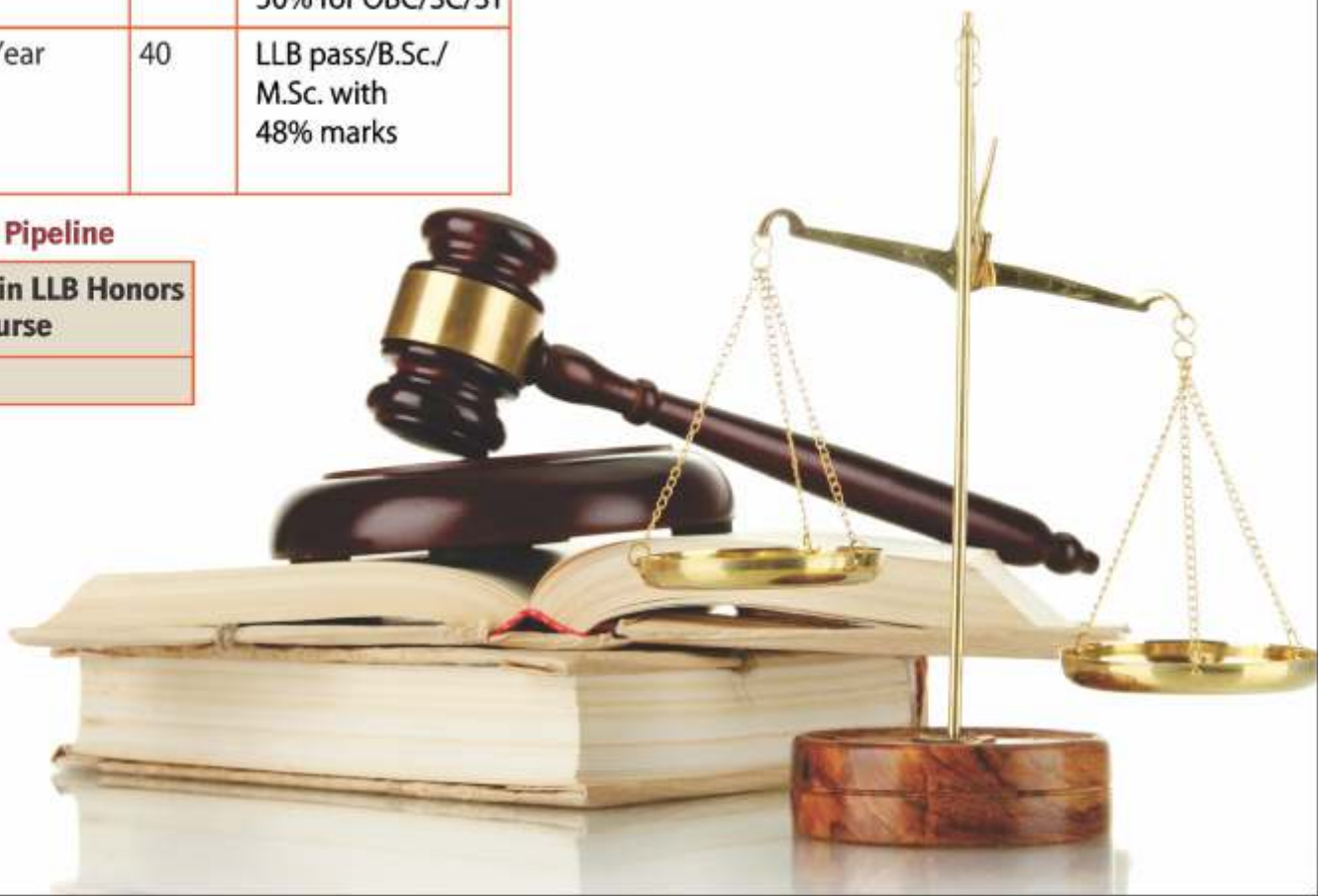

## **CENTRE FOR STUDIES ON MARGINAL SOCIETIES**

This centre was established by the Maharaja Ganga Singh University, Bikaner in May 2017 to study the socio-economic condition of Marginal Communities also referred to as poor, deprived, socially excluded and subalterns by the social scientist. The Centre aims at studying the causes of marginalization of communities, identification of the marginal groups through survey and field work, review policies and schemes introduced for uplifting the marginals and pin point those section of people who really deserve to be helped by the state. The centre will make efforts to prepare a road map for elimination of the conditions which leads to marginalization of a section of the society and which is also subjected to suffer from various forms of exploitation. To achieve it's aims and objectives this Centre, will carry out massive field work and survey, to conduct research studies on the marginal societies. Nomadic tribes, Hill people, Dalits, economically vulnerable, socially excluded section will be the target group of this prestigious centre. This centre is dedicated for betterment of the poorest of the poor in our society. Gautam Meghwanshi, Assistant Professor & Head is the Director of the centre.

## **CENTRE FOR WOMEN STUDIES**

Women's Studies was born out of the women's movement in India. As a body of theory, it emerged from the engagements of feminist scholars with pressing issues touching the lives of women. It was initially conceptualised as a branch of the social sciences and humanities. Women's Studies Centres were envisaged as playing an interventionist role by initiating the gender perspective in many domains in the generation of knowledge, the field of policy and practice. They were designed to act as catalysts for promoting and strengthening Women's Studies through teaching, research and field action projects:

The Centres for Women's Studies will be instrumental in incorporating Women's Studies perspective in various teaching programmes as well as in facilitating research in socially relevant issues, will provided consultation to scholars, contributed to development projects in various capacities, will generate resource material and documentation in the regions in which they are located and establish networking both within and outside the university system, will be instrumental in contributing to the visibility of women's issues, try to combine scholarship with socially relevant theories, and will be a medium in opening genuine interdisciplinary dialogues in several areas. It has engaged not only with the social sciences and humanities but with other disciplines like life sciences, biosciences and other areas of science and technology, such as agriculture and forestry, medicine and architecture. The biased gender perspective within these disciplines determines their very structures and need to be systematically critiqued by scholars in Women's studies. Under this Centre the university proposes to organise seminars, conferences, symposiums and other related activities in the direction of women empowerment.

## **TRAINING AND RESEARCH**

### **A. DIRECTORATE OF RESEARCH**

The Directorate of Research was founded in 2003. It conducts the following activities:

1. M.Phil., Ph.D. combined Entrance Test – (MPCET)
2. Ph.D. Course work
3. Registration and Award of the Ph.D. Degree.

The Directorate of Research offers the Degree of Doctorate in the Faculties of Arts in the subjects of Hindi, English, Sanskrit, Urdu and Philosophy; Social Science in the Subjects of Economics, Geography, History, Public Administration, Political Science and Sociology; Science in the Subjects of Botany, Biotechnology, Chemistry, Computer Science, Environment Science, Geology, Mathematics, Microbiology, Physics, Zoology; Commerce, Education and Law. Since its inception, the Directorate of Research has offered 857 Ph.D. Degrees till 31.12.2016. Besides, the MPCET and the Ph.D. course work Committee transact the task of holding the Entrance Test and organizing the Ph.D. Course work. In the award of Ph.D. Degree, the Directorate of Research follows the process as laid down in its Research Ordinance. To Ensure quality research the University has decided to confer Maharaja Ganga Singh Research Award to the Best Research from Academic Session 2018-19.

### **B. MADAN MOHAN MALVIYA CENTRE FOR VALUE EDUCATION**

The Centre is located on the main campus of Maharaja Ganga Singh University, Bikaner. It has come into existence after it was approved by the University competent authorities in 2016.

**VISION** Rebuilding/Reshaping India on the ideal cherished by Pt. Madan Mohan Malviya by propagating his ideas.

**MISSION** To work towards building a cultural India based on human values.

### **OBJECTIVES**

The centre shall –

1. Propagate the ideas of value education of Pt. Madan Mohan Malviya ji.
2. Promote projects/researches/studies, etc. aiming at the legacies, contributions, thoughts, etc. of Malviyajji.
3. Organize and sponsor regional/national/international level workshops/seminars/conferences, symposia in India and abroad.
4. Endeavour to launch ideologically driven diploma/certificate courses on the themes like 'Dream India of Malviyajji', etc.
5. Publish journals, magazines, souvenirs related to the Malviya's thoughts and ideas on value education.
6. Evolve e-materials, documentaries, film, etc based on Malviyajji's life.
7. Do all such activities and organize programmes which spread Malviyajji's thoughts in India and abroad.

The centre conducted an essay competition Mulya Shiksha Ke Sanvardhan Me Yuvao Ki Bhumika at the University level. In this competition 915 students participated. # CENTRAL LIBRARY

The University Central Library system seeks to provide all users with a welcoming, comfortable, and safe environment that promotes free intellectual exploration, research, and learning. It is the information resource center of excellence in the social sciences, humanities and basic sciences. It strives for full automation, a world-class collection and a staff of thoroughly modern information professionals. The library of the University offers well-managed, diverse collections of library resources and a knowledgeable and helpful staff. Its mission is to serve Maharaja Ganga Singh University students, faculty, and staff, as well as researchers and alumni. Members of the community are also welcome to use Library facilities, conforming to our Circulation Policy and our Access to Database Policy.



The Central Library prioritizes certain services, resources and space to the University community and affiliated researchers. In particular, Library computers are limited in number, and often in high demand. Therefore, priority use of library computers is reserved for students, faculty and staff engaged in education-related activities. The Library offers to its users Current Awareness Service, Circulation Service, Reference Services, Reprography service, E-Library services, Web-OPAC, Wi-Fi etc.

## ADMISSION RULES

- (1) The admission of students to the following courses shall be governed by Maharaja Ganga Singh University Rules for Admission of Students (MGSURAS). These rules shall be applicable to the following (except SFS courses) -
  - (i) All the Post Graduate (PG) Courses.
  - (ii) All the Graduate courses (UG) run by the University either in University Department or in its Constituent Colleges, if any.
- (2) Admission to various courses of study taught by the University may be made subject to the candidate fulfilling the conditions hereinafter prescribed for such a course.
- (3) Notwithstanding anything contained in any Ordinance, admission to any course of study cannot be claimed as a matter of right on the ground that the candidate fulfils the conditions prescribed for the course of study. The University reserves the right to refuse admission without assigning any reason for it.
- (4) The reservation of seats in admission for the students belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Backward Classes, women students, blind, deaf, dumb, Divyang, wards of defense personnel, wards of paramilitary personnel, wards of Kashmir displaced and Kashmir residents shall be made in accordance with the provisions of any law of the University for the time being in force or in accordance with the admission policy issued by the Commissionerate of College Education, State Government, notified for the session.\*

(\*The claim should be duly supported by certificate/document issued by the competent government authority.)

## ELIGIBILITY

1. No candidate may be eligible for admission to the course of study of Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Commerce and Bachelor of Science or any other UG course unless he/she has passed the qualifying Examination with minimum percentage of marks as notified by the University/Commissionerate of College Education, Government of Rajasthan for that session.
2. No candidate may be eligible for admission to the course of study of M.A./M.Sc. or any PG course unless he/she has passed the qualifying Bachelor's Degree Examination of the University or its equivalent.
3. At the time of counseling the student shall submit all the Mark Sheets, original certificates including Transfer Certificate/Character Certificate etc. failing which he/she shall not be entitled for admission.

## NON-ELIGIBILITY

1. A candidate shall not be eligible for admission to a course of study for an Examination unless he/she has passed the qualifying Examination of the University or any other Examination recognized for the purpose and possesses such other qualification (if any) as may be prescribed by the Ordinances; and
2. Any candidate against whom an FIR has been lodged by the University or any of the Constituent colleges or any affiliated college or any other competent authority/officer of the University/College shall not be eligible for admission as regular candidate in any of the Department of the University, or to appear at an Examination as a non-collegiate candidate where this facility is available; and
3. Any person who has been convicted of a criminal offence involving moral turpitude shall not be eligible for admission as a regular student in any of the Department of the university, or to appear at an Examination as a non-collegiate candidate where this facility is available; and
4. Any candidate who has indulged in misbehavior with a teacher or with any authority of the University may be debarred from seeking admission in any of the Department of the University.

Note: In case of non-clarification of facts, the Vice Chancellor may constitute a committee or refer to the Admission Board to Examination the above points before admitting such students in the University.

## PROCESS

1. The admission shall be made on the basis of merit as per the university rules.
2. The candidates who have appeared in the final year Examination of graduation/equivalent Examination or getting Supplementary and those whose result is awaited shall be eligible for admission provided that he/she clears the graduation/qualifying Examination by the date specified for the said purpose by the university.
3. Other admission criteria such as age, gap period, Interdisciplinary subjects, reservation policies etc. shall be as per the policy for UG and PG courses issued by the Commissionerate of College Education, Government of Rajasthan. Moreover, if there remains any ambiguity or these rules do not specify certain cases, the admission rules issued by the Commissionerate of College Education, Government of Rajasthan shall be applicable.

# CELLS

## INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

In pursuance of the National Action Plan of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) for performance evaluation, assessment and accreditation and quality upgradation of institutions of higher education, the NAAC proposes that every accredited institution establish an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) as a post-accreditation quality sustenance measure. The quality enhancement is a continuous process, the University IQAC works towards realizing the goals of quality enhancement and sustenance. The prime task of the University IQAC is to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in the performance of this institution. The IQAC shall make a significant and meaningful contribution in the post-accreditation phase of institution. During the post-accreditation period, the IQAC will channelize the efforts and measures of the institution towards academic excellence.

## ANTI SEXUAL HARASSMENT CELL

The main focus of Women Cell, is to create an enabling environment for justice where men and women can work together with a sense of personal security and dignity. The primary mission of the Women Cell of the University is to provide guidelines for protection from sexual harassment and basic right to work with dignity and to handle the related complaints received or referred to the cell.

The University is the recipient of prestigious international level coaching award in Athletics and has won medals in national/international level competitions such as Commonwealth, Para-Olympic World and Asian Tournaments. The University has received a total of 123 medals so far (Gold-21, Silver-38, Bronze-64).



## STUDENTS' SUPPORT SYSTEM AND STUDENTS' UNION

The distinct University Support System comprises Help desk at the Examination Block, Help Desks in every Teaching Department, the Deans, Students' Welfare and the University Proctor. The Deans, Students' Welfare guides the students in the conduction of cultural programmes and events, and serves as a channel to ensure the students' access to the Vice Chancellor in case the problem cannot be solved at the level of the Dean. The University Proctor is accountable for maintaining discipline on the campus. The Students' Support System has at its back-bone the representation of students at the University level in the form of University Students' Union. Besides Class Representatives, the students elect the President, the Vice-President, the General Secretary and the Joint Secretary. In the Students' Union Election held in 2016, were elected Vikram Singh (President), Jitendra Dhal (Vice President), Hitesh Ojha (General Secretary) and Bhawna (Joint Secretary).

The University has a Proctorial system, which deals with the problems connected with the maintenance of discipline on the University campus. A strict and immediate action is taken against the student who violates the discipline. All cases of indiscipline are reported to the parents of the defaulters. The parents of defaulters are also invited to discuss the cases of their wards in case the wards are found guilty. It also maintains a Defaulters' Register in which the record of all cases of indiscipline is kept.

Under ordinance 88, the following action can also be taken:

1. Entry of the defaulters and punishment given can be made in the Character/Transfer Certificate.
2. Character Certificate may be refused.
3. Admission in the next session may be refused.
4. Record of action taken or punishments given be communicated to future employers in case a confidential enquiry is received.

The University community is a family and any act of indiscipline is a loss to the whole institution. It is the moral duty of every student to safeguard the honour and fair name of his/her institution. The College/Department issues an identity card to every student. This must always be carried by every student with him. They must produce this card for identification whenever required by the authorities.

In case of indiscipline or breach of peace, the aggrieved party may report to the Proctor/Head of the Department concerned who will investigate and take disciplinary action. A copy of the report and action taken shall be sent to the office of the Chief Proctor for the purpose of record. The cases of indiscipline involving students of more than one Department will be dealt with by the Chief Proctor to whom the aggrieved party will send his complaint through the Proctor/Head of the Department.



## ACTIVITIES OF NSS



The youth activities under the aegis of NSS unit (informal) of Maharaja Ganga Singh University (MGSU), Bikaner started in the first academic session 2011-12 with a group of student volunteers. The activities started with in the university campus for environment enrichment and conservation through plantation, education and awareness. Plantation work was started as per the university master plan with the help of university state officer also started preservation through fencing, watering, upkeep and maintenance of the old plantation. In these activities the students from the affiliated colleges were also invited to participate. After regular workshops and training sessions with the student volunteers, they conducted environment education programs in the local schools and community in small groups. These programs targeted at local environment issues like air pollution, water pollution, pesticide contamination its impact on the human health, blood donation, Swachh Bharat Abheyan, awareness campaign against plastic, use of polythene bags, etc., for this we collaborated with the local communities especially women and younger generation, state forest department and local authorities engaged in Development work.

### **Anti-Ragging Cell**

To curb the menace of ragging on the campus and outside the campus, the University as per the directives of the University Grants Commission (UGC) has constituted

- Monitoring Cell on Ragging,
- Anti-Ragging Committee
- Anti-Ragging squad.

It was due to the constant patrolling of the Anti-Ragging Squad and the awareness measures initiated by the Anti Ragging Committee that no untoward incident has so far been reported.



## TRANSPORT FACILITY

Transport facility is available both for the students and the staff members in the University. The buses run daily from the campus to the city twice a day, in the morning and in the evening at specific timings.

## E-RIKSHAWS

The University has planned to start e-Rikshaws from the coming session in order to facilitate movement within the University campus and simultaneously maintain the eco-friendly environment within the campus.

## CANTEEN

The University Canteen provides the right ambience for informal get-together and serves a variety of culinary delights, cold and hot beverages and other best quality food material.





## **HOSTEL**

Currently the University provides hostel facilities to girls only. Some of its affiliated colleges provide hostel facilities at nominal fee. Rental and paying guest facilities are easily available in the vicinity of the campus. Attempts are being made to make available the leased accommodation for hostel, if needed. The University will soon start hostel facilities for boys too.

## **INTERNET**

The University Campus is completely connected with World Wide Web with 10 GBPS high speed Internet Connectivity. The facility is provided by BSNL under National mission on education through information and communication technology (NMEICT) project. The students and staff members can access internet within the campus any time.



## **UNIVERSITY POST OFFICE**

The University has a fully automated Electronic Post Office with EMS and Speed Post Service.

## **UNIVERSITY BANK**

The University has the branch of Punjab National Bank which is fully automated and computerized.

## **Helpdesk and Helpline Facility**

The University started Helpdesk and Helpline Facility for the prompt solution of the problems of the students in the University Campus from 5 July, 2017.
